and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and life of the world to come. Amen.

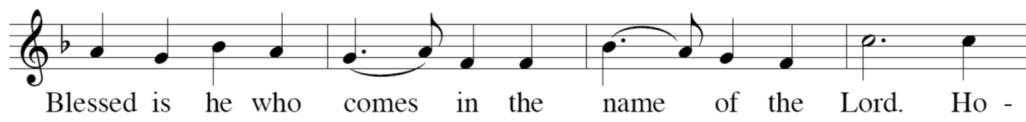
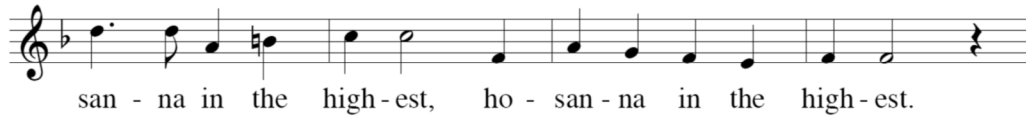


PRAYER TO MAKE A SPIRITUAL COMMUNION
